CIRCULAR

SUBJECT - STRENGTHENING PRAHARI ANTI-DRUG CLUBS IN ALL SCHOOLS

In continuation to the order No.F.42(15)/DE/PE& NI/Misc./2024-25/2264-74 dated 29/08/2025 on Formation of Anti-Drug Clubs named as "PRAHARI CLUB". The Council of Ministers GNCTD vide their decision No. 3213 dated 26.06.2025, has decided to constitute Anti- Drug Clubs named as " PRAHARI CLUB". The establishment of Prahari Clubs within schools is a crucial component of the Delhi government's multi-pronged approach to achieving a drug-free Delhi by 2027.

Conceptualized under the guidance of the National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), the NCORD Committee, and the Directorate of Education, this club aims to foster drug-free educational environments, create safe spaces and foster a culture of student-led vigilance, awareness, and community engagement for preventive efforts against substance abuse.

Substance use among adolescents remains a critical public health issue, adversely impacting students' mental health, physical well-being, and academic outcomes. The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) emphasizes the importance of a people-centred approach to drug policies, focusing on human rights, compassion, and evidence-based practices. To address this, proactive intervention and prevention strategies at the school level are essential.

Objectives of Anti-Drug Clubs named as "PRAHARI CLUB" inside the school:

- 1. Raise awareness on the personal, social, health, and legal impacts of substance abuse.
- 2. Prohibit and report the sale and use of drugs/substances in and around school campuses.
- 3. Identify at-risk children and link them with EVGCs and counselling support.
- 4. Promote vigilance among students through peer-led advocacy.

All the Heads of Schools of Govt., Govt-Aided & Recognized-Unaided Private Schools are directed to constitute the Prahari Clubs & strengthen the club with meaningful, age-appropriate awareness activities/initiatives and submit the compliance report as per the timelines.

- At all levels confidentiality and non-judgemental perspective to be maintained by all the stakeholder involved in matters related to safety and privacy of the children. However, care must be taken to prevent any stigma or discrimination of the child in school
